

God's Faithfulness is the message that Diane McLean shares with us this morning, based on the lectionary reading for 5th October – Lamentations 3:19-26:

I remember my affliction and my wandering, the bitterness and the gall.

I well remember them, and my soul is downcast within me.

Yet this I call to mind and therefore I have hope:

Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed, for His compassions never fail.

They are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness.

I say to myself, "The LORD is my portion; therefore I will wait for Him."

The LORD is good to those whose hope is in Him, to the one who seeks Him; it is good to wait quietly for the salvation of the LORD.

The passage is the most bright spot, which focusses on the fact that, despite the hard things that we may be facing. God is faithful and will help us through.





This week we were majorly blessed when one of our extremely helpful church members (who seems to have an anointing of being in the right place at the right time (2) happened to visit a shop that was closing down in town and ask what they were planning to do with their shelving. The man there said that he had offered the shelving to the Salvation Army, but they had declined, and that we could have the lot for free if we could take it away.
