Women's 'Growth Group' – Meets fortnightly on Thursdays at 1pm in the Church House.



and been working on over the past 2 weeks – **both inside the auditorium, and outside on the Church lawns** –

should all come together in completion today (Friday). It has been a lot of work but so much fun too. Here (left and right) are pics of some of what is being prepared this week. (Thank you Justin for your help in cutting out our scenes). Remember, the season



of Advent in the Christian calendar anticipates the

"coming of Christ" from three different perspectives: 1) The physical nativity in Bethlehem; 2) The reception of Christ in the heart of the believer; and 3) The eschatological (final things/results), of Christ's Second Coming. By Christmas Day, we will have shared these 3 Gospel truths clearly with all who come or even just pass by.

Last Sunday morning in our Service, one person experienced No. 2 above – a most powerful infilling of Jesus by the Spirit. Tears of joy and forgiveness flowed. We delight with them and at some point you will hear more of this testimony and it's many parts that led to this, but I can say that the 'Nativity' display project played a big part in this too. Folks please never underestimate the fact that Jesus' presence meets with us here - Hebrews 2:12, For He said to God, "I will proclaim your name to my brothers and sisters. I will praise you among your assembled people."

Today in our Service, we build our worship and word around chapter 25 of Matthew's Gospel, which is all about No. 3 above – Christ's Second Coming at the end of the Ages. There are two parables that depict 'The Kingdom of Heaven' at this end of the Age we are in. Then Jesus describes in absolute clarity, His Judgment words on that Day which is coming. It is challenging reading, but our key Scripture that we take away is Matthew 25:13 "Keep awake ..."
