

Stewart writes ...

Today we commence a 4 week teaching series on the theme 'Jesus Christ – The Fullness of GOD'. Each week we will be meditating on these key Scriptures that reveal this vital truth to us:

Sunday 4 Sept - Hebrews 1:1-3; Sunday 11 Sept - Philippians 2:4-11; Sunday 18 Sept - John 5:19-24; Sunday 25 Sept - Colossians 1:15-20



Today we start with the beautiful expressions that commence the Letter to the Hebrews. Andrew Murray says, 'In every possible way Hebrews sets before us the truth that it is only the full and perfect knowledge/revelation of what Christ is and does for us, that can bring us to a full and perfect Christian life'.

Now published this week in 'Plough', is this beautiful testimony of His radiance...



A modern Saint Francis, Sundar Singh left his family and ancestral faith to follow Jesus without Western trappings. (By Susannah Black Roberts). Punjab, India, 1903. The fourteen-year-old boy wakes up at three in the morning, bathes, and chants the Sikh morning prayer. "One universal creator God. His name is Truth. Creative being personified ... Image of the Undying, beyond birth, self-existent ... How can you become truthful? And how can the veil of illusion be torn away?" His mother had taught him the prayers. She had been, he said, "a living example of the love of God." And now she was dead. Three days before, at school, he had horrified

his father by burning a Bible. He was full of frustration and rage. The gurus his mother had taken him to meet had themselves been hunters after God, seekers of the peace he himself craved. And this Christianity was the religion of the colonizers. *"I prayed,"* he wrote later of that moment, *"that if there was a God at all, He would reveal himself to me. Should I receive no answer by morning, I would place my head on the railroad tracks and seek the answer to my questions beyond the edge of this life." An hour and a half later, he saw something like a glow in the room. And then he saw someone in the light. That someone spoke, in Urdu, <i>"Sundar, how long will you mock me? I have come to save you because you have prayed to find the way of truth. Why then don't you accept it?"* It was then I saw the marks of blood on his hands and feet and knew that it was Yesu, the one proclaimed by the Christians. In amazement I fell at His feet. I was filled with deep sorrow and remorse for my insults and my irreverence, but also with a wonderful peace. This was the joy I had been seeking... The 10am service is live streamed.
