<u>Temporary Accommodation</u> – We have had some temporary accommodation offers. If you know someone needing temporary accommodation, please contact Dione in the office.



**Stewart writes...** 3 weeks on from Cyclone Gabrielle and I could not have imagined in this past week – yet another two traumatic rainfall events creating havoc in our region and affecting more of our church folk. First, on Friday and Saturday last week, Al & Sal Clement's tenuous access road to their home at Waingake, was hit with further flood damage and they could not get out with their 2wd car. Today they could, but if it rains it's mud. Then on Monday night/early Tuesday morning, came the Mangapapa deluge, and by God's grace that Dianne Holland escaped from her car just in time before it was swept away. **You can view her story here** At the same time Isla and son Ben Florence, had a frightening moment with their stream floodwater bringing a large sleep-out shed crashing into their access bridge and just touching distance from Ben who was in the floodwaters, seeking to secure gas bottles. Others had less dramatic flooding, but like Perrin & Ashley Mountfort, have had to throw out items from their flooded garage and dry out.

There is much going on to support folk in the ways we can. Thank you to those providing meals and morning teas for folk at present. This recovery will be a long process and we will have resources to assist at different parts of the journey. Remember that Dione and Paul are making the office lounge available for morning tea and a chat during the week for anyone that needs to share, find help or advice at this time.
