I am pleased to advise this week that MUP Church received an unexpected Grant from the 'Sunrise Foundation' of \$5,000 – for distribution to flood affected folk in need, within and/or outside of our church. We have also received several other donations, some from previous church members now living in other centres. This is wonderful but is also a responsibility, and so a small group (chaired by elder, Paul Madsen) has been set up oversee this assessment and distribution of funds given.

We continue to support folk in the ways we can. Meals and morning teas for folk are continuing this week for those who still need that help. Remember too that the office lounge is open for morning tea during the week for anyone needing to chat.

## Te Wiremu Lifecare Church Services – MUP


