'Men's Group' – Meets weekly on Tuesdays at 7.30am, currently at Noel Dunn's place. Contact John Hawksworth for more info.

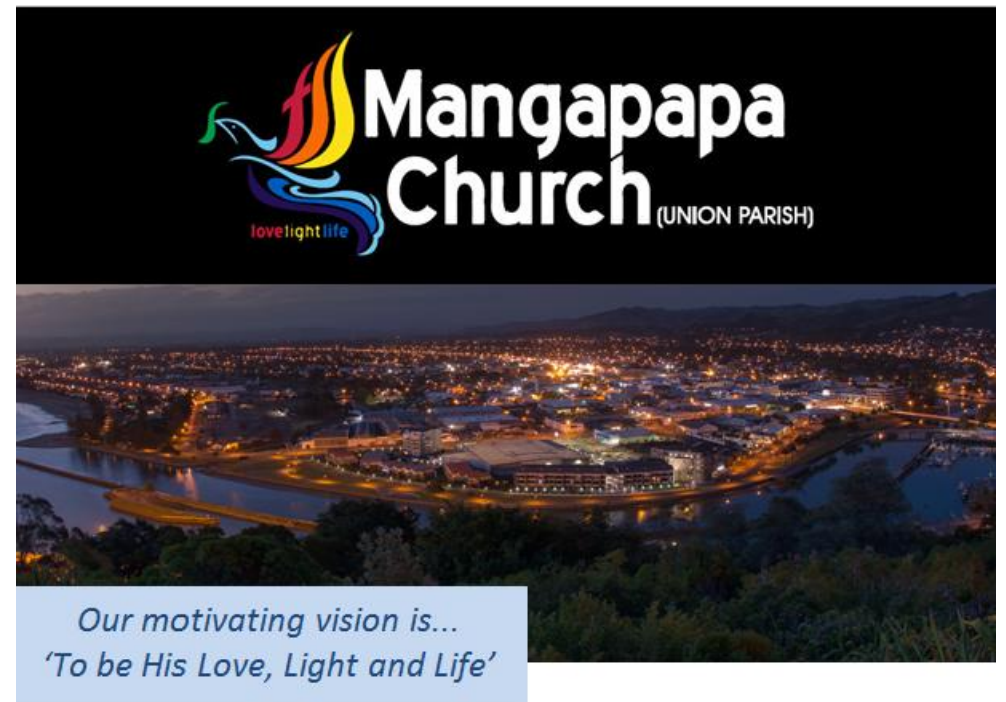

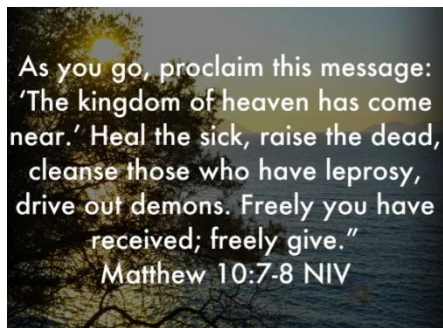

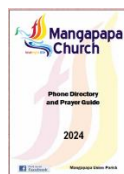

St Andrews & Matawhero Historic Churches – Celebration Weekend

Over Kings Birthday Weekend the Gisborne Presbyterian Parish, comprising these two Churches, held what was described as a 'bittersweet celebration' marking the end of Presbyterian Church worship at these two church locations, since 1873. Several MUP Church folk attended some of the 6 different events held over the weekend as they have been strong connections over the years. Cecily Trafford is one who came to faith at St Andrews in her childhood. She also remembers some great 'missions' held there and Corrie ten Boom preaching there in the 1950's! Marilyn Partick's great-grandfather, Matthew Hall, was a founding member of St Andrews Church in 1873 and its first treasurer. Another great-grandfather, Robert Gardner, served as minister at Matawhero Church from 1898 to 1908. One of the most powerful moments of impromptu testimony shared over the weekend, came from Cherie Bell on Saturday morning and the Matawhero Historic Church. She gave profound thanksgiving for growing up in the church and her Sunday School Teachers, where she became a Christian, before moving away from Gisborne at age 16. As to the future of these two historic Church sites/buildings, there are discussions, ideas and hopes for their future community use.
