

Shane shares the message this morning. He writes ...

There are many areas in our walk with Jesus that should challenge us in the context of church life. After all, one of the reasons we gather is to "encourage one another and build each other up" (1 Thessalonians 5:11).

It's easy to focus on the spiritual aspects of our faith - prayer, worship, praise, reading Scripture, sharing the gospel, and so on. Yet service is often spoken of as if it were a secondary, optional extra. For me, that is a devastating shame - not because the church simply needs more "hands on deck," but because every one of us is called to serve one another. To live a full Christian life without serving is, in truth, to miss out on living a full Christian life. This Sunday, we'll explore why.

This year marks 200 hundred years since the baptism of Christian Rangi, the first Māori baptised by

the missionaries as a Christian convert. Henry Williams, who conducted the baptism on 14 September 1825, described Rangi as a "brand plucked from the burning" (Zech. 3:2), pointing to the providential nature of Rangi's conversion. The story is a fascinating one, and is told here at this link to the NZ Christian Network Newsletter this month. The Missionary Richard Davis in this conversion story, just happens to be the great, great, great Grandfather of Bill Wheeler. MUP Church has made a point of highlighting the many wonderful '200yrs of the Gospel in NZ' stories since the first celebrations in 2014. It is vital that this Gospel history is not lost, but remembered, celebrated and told to new generations.
