

Andrew McDonough, from Australia, is the creator of the brilliant 'Lost Sheep' stories that we use from time to time here at MUP. Today it is, 'Jesus was a Refugee'. Andrew says... 'Jesus was a Refugee' is based on that unsettling bit of the Christmas story in Matthew 2:1-23. This never makes it into the end of year nativity play. Fair enough. Who wants to traumatise the kids with Bad King Herod, the atrocities in Bethlehem and a dull ending where the family drifts off to Nazareth. Compare that to the five star, family friendly version where the





bad guy's an inn keeper, the crisis a travel accommodation mix up, and it all ends with a magnificent shepherd dancing, angel singing, expensive gifting, new born baby finale. So, why tell the escape to Egypt story to children? Simply because it is a Jesus story and it mirrors the story of 70 million people including 25 million children around the world who have been forced from their homes. Over the last 27 years I have worked with hundreds of refugees. This

story is for Hoa who arrived in Australia as a disabled orphan, then returned to Vietnam to found a community run entirely by people with disabilities. It's for David Jock, who as a child was separated from his parents, walked from Sudan to Ethiopia, and now mentors young people from all cultures. It's for my children, who snuggled up to mums who had lost babies and played with kids who didn't share their language. And this story is for your children. May they know safety from danger and grow up to treat any refugee they meet as if they were Jesus.

Stewart writes... School is out for summer and we commence 'Christmas Week 2022' today with the Christmas Family Service, followed by a Church BBQ & Pot Luck **Lunch**. We do hope the weather improves a bit for it, and for the 'Carols by Candlelight' event on Friday evening. This year both Christmas Day and New Years Day fall on a Sunday, which is great. It makes organisation a bit easier and personally, I wish it could be that way every year!



One thing I want to mention, is that over the past few weeks we have had a 'homeless' man sleeping in his blue car on the MUP Church property at night, sometimes in the carpark and sometimes on the side lawn. Paul and myself have spoken with him and sought to understand his situation, and began seeking ways we may help him. However, as we investigated further, we discovered (from HOB pastors), he has a long history of refusing help, creating messes, and is quite happy with this lifestyle, despite what he may say to the contrary. We are taking

measures to move him on. A neighbour of the church is concerned with his behaviours too along the boundary.



We are taking a break from 'Livestreaming' our Services over the holidays. Stats are showing the need for this service is not great over summer, but if we find there is demand for it, we will start it up again. Do let Stewart know if this decision detrimentally affects you?

We just feel with rising Covid infections again in the community, and with the attendance we usually get to this, we will keep it in the outdoor setting.
