Women's 'Growth Group' – Meets fortnightly on Thursdays at 1pm in the Church House. Contact Elaine Oates or Diane McLean for more info.


Found – After church last Sunday, a USB stick was found on the ground just outside the church front door. If you have lost one, please see Dione in the office.



Paul's letters to the Corinthian church repeatedly use the words, 'the gospel' and 'proclaim the gospel'. He is writing to a church he knows well, having founded it, but which is full of problems and issues. Throughout the letters he addresses the problems, and then uses the gospel of Jesus crucified and risen, to answer the problems. They are letters full of difficult conversations, but in these 5 verses at the beginning of 1st Corinthians, Paul writes with incredible thankfulness, because it is God who is faithful when they/we are not. It is God who will keep them/us to the end when we cannot see a way forward.



I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that was given you in Christ Jesus, that in every way you were enriched in him in all speech and all knowledge— even as the testimony about Christ was confirmed among you— so that you are not lacking in any gift, as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ, who will sustain you to the end, guiltless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.
