Stewart writes... Last week we stayed 3 nights in Cam, Gloustershire, with great friends of ourselves and of MUP Church - David & Monica Stevenson. Back in 2007, they happened to be touring NZ and attended MUP one Sunday morning. We got talking after the Service, found out they had run 'The Marriage Course', and other Marriage seminars. The end result was they remained with us in Gisborne doing seminars and church life together for the next 5 years. Now they are back home in the UK supporting their Church there. We also met some new friends in Tewkesbury, who showed us around the magnificent Abbey. Built in the 10th century, it would have been destroyed by King Henry 8th, who destroyed so many, but the people of Tewkesbury got together and bought it, thwarting him! They paid £453 – an enormous sum in the 16th Century - to buy their parish church and, in so doing, saved the magnificent building for future generations. We also saw the first Baptist Church in the world, built in sight of the Abbey, now gifted to the Tewkesbury Museum, but used on special occasions too.
