

# Diane McLean shares the message this morning. She writes ...

It's always good to use the discipline of choosing a reading from the Lectionary. Today's passage is a challenging one, but important in its message. Matthew 22:1-14, "For many are invited, but few are chosen."



**Stewart writes...** The threat of another full scale war in Israel, Gaza and beyond is disturbing for us all

as believers and it is natural for us to wonder and speculate as to what the Lord is doing? Or what 'time' is it on God's end of this Age/'day of the Lord' clock? But there are unhelpful side-tracks in dwelling on that. Here are two vital actions I believe we are to practice today to keep a healthy perspective;

- 1) Pray Psalm 122, "Pray for the peace of Jerusalem." When 'true peace' comes to Jerusalem, there will be peace everywhere. Also, 1 Timothy 2 encourages "...petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness." This is what we will do collectively too, on Sunday evening 5<sup>th</sup> November.
- **2) Keep our focus on the Lord!** Hebrews 12:2, "...simply fixing our gaze upon Jesus, our Prince Leader in the faith, who will also award us the prize..." If our thoughts and conversations as believers are more about what fallen mankind is doing in their flesh, and what 'man' needs to do to fix things, we will become distracted to political ideologies, theories and conspiracies that are of this world and are not for us to dwell upon. Nothing of fallen mankind should surprise us. But we do pray, "Come, Lord Jesus!"


