

experience in vocational Christian work and has worked for Sports Chaplaincy New Zealand since its inception in 2013. Matt provides chaplaincy support to Gymnastics New Zealand and AUT Millennium on Auckland's North Shore. AUT Millennium is High Performance Sport NZ's main training for hub for high performance athletes and coaches as well as a multi-sport facility servicing the general public. A life-long learning Matt has degrees in science and law and has recently completed his Masters in Chaplaincy through the University of Otago. Matt



oversees the training of all new Sports Chaplains, and runs in-person workshops which help them become accredited and ready to serve. If he's not in the office running the background of SCNZ, Matt is out tramping with his family or working on a DIY job.

Today Matt shares a message from Luke 8:4-15. He writes ...

The Parable of the Soils is one of the most familiar of Jesus' parables describing peoples' different responses to the word of God. This parable is a favourite with Sports Chaplaincy because we consider the sower's response in the wake of the peoples' various responses. We imagine in between seed sowing seasons a wise and diligent sower becomes a



cultivator. The work is no longer seed sowing but breaking up the hard soil, removing the rocks, pulling out the weeds and enriching the soil in preparation for the new season of sowing and harvest. In this view the Parable of the Soils calls us into preparation work that goes to the unproductive places and to bring about change so that the word of God can take root, grow and flourish in peoples' lives.
