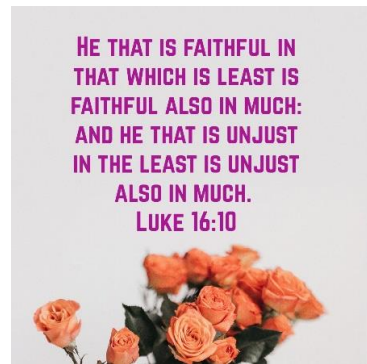

Bill Wheeler attends 200^{YRS} Davis Family Celebration

Bill is one of the descendants of Richard & Mary Anne Davis – pioneering missionaries of the Te Waimate Mission in the Bay of Islands, and their daughter marrying Joseph Matthews, pioneering an incredible mission and Church in Kaitiāia. It is an amazing story we have shared here. Bill says of his time last week – *"Oh what a terrific time away. Many great people (all*

relations) to meet - quite a few strong believers...and others not so. But still a wonderful and rich heritage, and of course with very early NZ Maori interaction. Much discussion around the Treaty as you would expect. One highlight was getting to climb into the steeple of the old Waimate Mission Church and ring the bell for the Sunday service...way cool! What an honour... The Local Minister, Elgin Edwards, what a character... he spoke a strong Gospel Sermon, and was unapologetic to say to the congregation that ole Richard Davis/Joseph Matthews and other missionaries would want you to experience the saving power of Christ etc...wonderful stuff!"



Note: THE ACORN SYMBOL on the 200-Year Reunion logo comes from the acorn Richard Davis brought all the way from England. Planted in Paihia in 1824, the oak sapling was transplanted and lived until 2018 at Te Waimate - a ripe age of 194 years.
