When in Wairoa leading the St Andrews service 2 weeks ago, I listened to another story of how people have been financially impacted by Cyclone Gabrielle. This person had travelled to Napier for major dental work in the week prior to Cyclone Gabrielle. Then in the days following the cyclone, the work done on their teeth was flaring up and they were advised to get back down to Napier as soon as possible, but how? The medical flights were unavailable to them, so they had to immediately book flights on Air NZ. Being Gisborne - Auckland - Napier and return. The flights cost them \$2,000! Like us, St Andrews has received monetary gifts for those affected by flooding, but this person never thought they might qualify for help from that. There are many different ways folk have been affected and how we can help.



Last Sunday the children enjoyed watching the remarkable story of missionary Amy Carmichael, and her work with children in India. Today I will refer to just a portion of that, with how it started – a little girl wrenching Amy's cross from

her neck, knowing it spoke of freedom and life. We in Aotearoa NZ, also have a story of

unknown folk visiting our shores, and their cross wrenched from their neck, but it too would speak of life to those in darkness in the years that followed.
