Paula writes....

Depending on where you are up to with The Prayer Course – this week's focus has been on Petition – praying for our needs. And we have been encouraged to Keep it simple, Keep it real and Keep it up! To break-down our big prayers into small steps – and then pray consistently for those steps. We have also been encouraged to do this at



set times during the day – to help us form regular rhythms of prayer. Continuing to use the Lord's Prayer as a framework is another helpful tool here. It was moving last week to hear the Lord's Prayer in at least 4 languages – and I hope we will hear more yet.

From looking at our own needs we will move on to Intercession - which Stewart will be looking at with us at today. This is praying on behalf of others, crying out for the things of God where we see brokenness in our world. Sometimes this can be overwhelming – where do we start?

Frank challenged us last Sunday – to be praying for the Leaders of our city and nation, and gave an example where their prayer to "improve or remove" occurred the same week as a Prime minister resigned! When we consider politics - it is easy to point the finger and complain – but when we start praying, sometimes instead we develop empathy and a passion to be a part of making a difference.

Maybe your heart is more toward some of the brokenness we see in our society – broken families, poverty, violence, addictions, or even the flip side – greed, pride, lack of concern for others and selfish gain. Let's find ways we can pray specifically into the needs and challenges of our communities: for justice, healing, reconciliation, generosity and concern for others. And let's do this consistently and specifically.

Then moving further afield - there are lot of resources around for helping us pray for our world. Maybe God has put a particular issue or country on your heart. Go with this and pray into this area. There's a wonderful resource called Operation World which helps us pray for the world. In it there is information on every country of the world and the church there, different religions, statistics and challenges facing that nation. Then it helps with specifics about how to pray for that nation and our brothers and sisters in Christ in that place...

I am sure from this there are several places or ways we can be growing in our prayers. I look forward to hearing more stories about how God is answering.

There is nothing the nearness of Jesus cannot overcome.

Our family are away this weekend at a wedding. Thanks to those looking after the service today.

Blessings as you grow in prayer and grow in loving Jesus this week. See who you can encourage in their journey too.Paula
