

Thanks to those who came to the youth Quiz night, some fierce competition and a lot of fun. Welcome back to Uni students who have finished their year already! Congratulations to several of our Senior Secondary students who have won awards and scholarships – well done! Prayers and courage for those heading into external exams this week. If you see one of these older Youth around, ask them how you can pray for them heading into this time.

This week it was a privilege to meet with other pastors in Gisborne, with Dave Mann who leads The Hope Project and Shining Lights Trust in New Zealand. This year in thinking to Christmas, their project is to encourage us to think of gentle and creative ways of returning the Christmas story to Christmas, through using the image of the Nativity scene. Why? He says:

"Christ has been all-but fully removed from CHRISTmas nationally, including on television, in print-media, Council decorations, shopfront windows, and even the

inclusion of nativity-related lyrics in CHRISTmas carols in many shops and some public Christmas carol gatherings. We are incredibly blessed. Let's not forget, or be embarrassed by, who we are or where we came from!"

Our invitation is to be intentional about using nativity-based CHRISTmas themes in our areas of influence – as opposed to Santa, elves or jingle bells. This can be done in a number of simple ways: posters, nativity scenes on your lawn, Christmas cards or pictures on your window.
