

Paula writes....

Being a Jesus follower is not easy. Daily we are called to be faithful and live in a way that, at times, goes against the culture and beliefs around us. We make decisions and choices (some seen – others that no one else sees) that are our decisions to honour God and follow Jesus. It could be a choice to leave our anger behind and forgive, a choice to give generously even though it costs us, a choice to serve someone when we would rather do something for ourselves. It could be career choices that value service over financial security. It could be time choices, relationship choices, lifestyle choices. Jesus said some pretty radical things about caring for the poor and the comprehensiveness of our good news message.

In Luke's gospel Jesus stands up to read in the temple and picks out a particular prophetic word from Isaiah....

'The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.'





As Jesus' followers this is our mandate also. This week we invite those of you who would like to and are able, to take on the "Matthew 25 Challenge". Each day there is a particular activity/challenge and we also watch the story of a person in the developing world and the particular situations they face. I invite you to participate in as much as you are able.

As we know, loving the poor and proclaiming good news is something we need right here in our community and city. This week I was privileged to go to a Pastors Day run by CAP (Christians Against Poverty) and it was so encouraging to hear of CAP ministries all around NZ supporting individuals and families in financial strife to gain freedom, and in some of the other CAP areas - providing support with life skills, work skills and addiction support.

Christian leaders in our city are working together, particularly through Te Hahi, but also in other ways to bring hope and life to our city. As part of this there is not only the Combined Te Hahi service this weekend, but also a whole night of prayer coming up to prayer for our city. Mangapapa Church is responsible in particular for the 3am–5am slot !!! ③ But you are welcome to join at any time. There is also an

opportunity to pray for our city every Wednesday from 10.30am–11.30am. These prayer gatherings are being hosted at the AOG Church on Grey Street.

Thank you to those who prayed for us as a Leadership Team as we spent time on a retreat yesterday. Please continue also to pray for our Alpha Course on Tuesday nights.
