

A Word About 'Prophecy' – If you are under the age of say, 75yrs, you will know that these times we are living in are unique & peculiar in our lifetime. Believers are not unaffected and there are many voices out there, often conflicting voices, proclaiming what they believe God is up to in all of this. Within our Worship Services here at MUP, we encourage and allow space for prayers, praise and words of encouragement, to come forward from the congregation. The Spiritual gift of 'prophecy' may include all of those forms as it can be 'forth-telling' as well as 'fore-telling'. The key point for us in a public worship Service, is the apostle Paul's direction in 1 Cor. 14:1-3,

"Follow the way of love and eagerly desire gifts of the Spirit, especially prophecy. For anyone who speaks in a tongue does not speak to people but to God. Indeed, no one understands them; they utter mysteries by the Spirit. But the one who prophesies speaks to people for their strengthening, encouraging and comfort."

Scripture defines very clearly what this gift of prophecy produces, by way of the words spoken – <a href="theywill-be-words-of-strengthening/edification">they will be words of strengthening/edification</a>, <a href="encouragement/exhortation-and-comfort">encouragement/exhortation-and-comfort</a>. If the words spoken do not meet these criteria, then it is not of the Lord. The prophetic gift then, is the ability to bring forth God's word independently of our own thoughts, ideas and knowledge. It will never contradict Scripture and must always uplift Jesus and edify/strengthen God's people. On The Day of Pentecost, the gift of prophecy changed from Old Testament manifestations and we are in that Day! Acts 2:16-18

"No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy."

So of course your MUP Elders will - "not quench the Spirit, nor despise the words of prophets, but test everything" (1 Thess. 5:19-21). We ask that if any have a word that has a correction, warning, or different to the above, please in the first instance submit that word to the Elders for consideration.
