



## Paula writes...

"Dear brothers and sisters, when troubles of any kind come your way, consider it an opportunity for great joy. For you know that when your faith is tested, your endurance has a chance to grow. So let it grow, for when your endurance is fully developed, you will be perfect and complete, needing nothing." (James 1:2-4)



Wow it's been a long haul but we have made it to Level 2. So back to school for many this week, and returning to work for others. For those of you whose work is still in question or who even may not have work to return to, our prayers are with you and please let us know how we can support you at this time.

Although our freedoms are increased, we are still urged to live and interact cautiously and won't be gathering as a church family. Under Level Two guidelines gatherings must not be more than 10, so for at least the next two Sundays we will continue to worship in our homes. The church building itself will also remain completely closed, both for COVID reasons and because we have had a major leak which is requiring significant repairs to our hallway and toilet.

We are required by Presbytery to develop of a COVID-19 Safety Plan for all our church activities, that meets government guidelines as well as meeting our health and safety obligations towards employees, users, and visitors. We are currently working on this and hope to have it complete this week.

Once this is complete, we will be able to open the church office, with safety guidelines in place and procedures such as contact tracing. The recommendations are also, that it would be better if small groups waited until after these two weeks to begin. Individual small group leaders can discuss their particular group with me, and if any are to meet, *"requirements for catering, physical distancing, contact tracing, personal and venue hygiene must be adhered to as a Home Group is an extension of the authorised ministries of the parish and net a private event"* 

not a private event."

Saying all this, as you feel able I hope you do enjoy the freedoms of being able to safely meet up with one or two others, to encourage each other and connect informally.

We continue in the book of Ephesians this Sunday. Ephesians 1 A PEOPLE FORMED AND SHAPED BY THE STORY OF THE GOSPEL A PEOPLE TURNING FROM IDOLS TO WORSHIP OUR LORD & GOD A PEOPLE PURSUING TRUTH, BEAUTY, & GOODNESS WILLOW A GOODNESS A PEOPLE BOUND TOGETHER IN A NEW COMMUNITY A PEOPLE SENT TO SEEK THE GOOD OF OUR CITY was about our identity in Christ, the first part of Chapter 2 was God making the dead alive, and the second part which we look at this week shows us how the gospel not only changes our vertical relationship with God but our horizontal relationships with each other. In Christ we not only have new identity, but new community, new family and peace despite our differences.

May I encourage you to stay strong in following Him and all that means, even in this challenging time. And find ways to live this out in both worship, and also love for and service to others.
