Paula writes...

I wonder if you have been watching "The Chosen"? Season Two is now well underway, and these are a wonderful look at the life of Jesus. As I watch, I am blown away yet again at His love, compassion, wisdom, honesty and ability to connect with people. It makes me excited to be one of His followers.



However, I am also reminded of the challenges – when I see people unable to make the jump or sacrifice needed to become followers. Today we look at one of Jesus' hardest but clearest teachings – that following Him means taking up a cross as He did.

Luke 9:18 - Once when Jesus was praying in private and his disciples were with him, he asked them, "Who do the crowds say I am?"¹⁹ They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, that one of the prophets of long ago has come back to life."²⁰ "But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?" Peter answered, "The Christ of God."²¹ Jesus strictly warned them not to tell this to anyone.²² And he said, "The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, chief priests and teachers of the law, and he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life."²³ Then he said to them all: "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow

me.²⁴ For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me will save it.

Max Lucado says this:

"Jesus gives us one of His hardest teachings of all when He says: "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me will save it." The word that Jesus uses for "deny yourself" literally means in the Greek to "say no to yourself." This is one of Jesus' hardest teachings, not because it is difficult to understand, but because it is so difficult to implement. For most of us we do not like to say "No" to ourselves. That is one of the reasons why it is so difficult to overcome addictive behaviour – alcohol, internet images, lying, gossip, etc. But Jesus says that if we want to be a follower of His, we, with His help are called to say "No" to ourselves and say "Yes" to Him. It is a willing, cheerful understanding that we live not for self but for Him who loves us and gave Himself for us. It is a life that is lived in harmony with God, in works of service to our neighbour out of love for Christ. This is what pleases God."

May God give us the grace to follow Him each day, even when it really costs. And when we don't, to receive His grace and forgiveness and try again.
