
## Stewart writes ...

## 3 Preachers today, with short encouraging messages you will enjoy!

1) Justin Dyas – 'Getting Wise'.

Where does wisdom come from? How does a young man become wise? Does it come from a book? The internet? Well Justin will share how an accident and a Proverb from Scripture led him on the journey to finding wisdom in the Book of Proverbs, and ultimately wisdom is the Lord Jesus.





2) Marilyn Patrick – 'They Looked For a City'. How precious is our personal relationship with the Lord. It is a privilege and we each have a story. Marilyn shares how this book, which she found in a box of many books given to the church library recently, encouraged her as she read their story and the powerful impact on this Orthodox Jewish Family that getting to know Jesus Christ made. It wasn't all easy for them, but our God was faithful.

3) Nona Aston - 'Understanding God's Ways' Isaiah 55:9. "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts." Being offended with God is easy for non-believers and questions such as, "If God is real, why does God permit so much suffering?", are used to justify unbelief in Jesus. But

Nona, this morning, relates her experience of earnest seeking in the night hours, and the Lord's answer to her, in the shower, Amen! - I wonder how many of you have received the Lord's wisdom in the shower or bath?
