

Paula writes...

Today we begin preparing ourselves for the celebration of Jesus' birth, as we begin a series called 'The Christmas Experience'. Over the next few weeks we will look at different aspects of the Christmas story, and its impact not only on world history but also to each of our own lives. Today we look at the challenge of waiting, and remind ourselves about our faithful God who does keep His promises. Things that stand out:

- Prom the Fall in Genesis 3 to the promises to David that his reign would last forever, from the prophets to the 400 years of "silence" in between Malachi and Matthew, Israel was waiting on God.
- Even though they believed God, and even though they put their hope in His
 promise of deliverance, when God's people wait for Him, they begin to ask
 the question of faithfulness: Will God keep His promise?
- That question is the hinge on which Christianity turns. If God doesn't keep His promises then what are we waiting for? But if He does – that changes everything.
- As God's people waited for that first Christmas, they were undoubtedly
 asking the question of faithfulness. And as we wait for God to keep His
 promises to us, we often ask the same question.
- Since most of our lives are spent waiting on God to keep many different promises, but especially His ultimate promise to return, what can we learn from the Christmas story about waiting on God?

Waiting is one of the themes of Advent, of these weeks leading to Christmas. As we re-look at the familiar story may God give us new insights into His incredible plan, and new confidence in His faithfulness. Whatever our prayer, or situation, or worry: He is faithful, He does see and hear, and we are not forgotten. May He give us strength, based on this knowledge to wait, even when it is hard.
