Hello from a distance,

What a challenging few weeks we have had. Sunday before last we were welcoming our YWAM team and preparing for having a great two weeks of having them serve amongst us in Mission and Pastoral Care. The week started well with preparing for an outreach, a Matrix event and for leading the Sunday service. They also were able to speak at assemblies at Sonrise School. Tuesday changed everything



when we headed into a snap, but we hoped brief, lockdown. Now, 12 days later we remain under lockdown, several of us have had vaccines and COVID tests, we have again found ways to live in relative isolation, and we watch and wait for how things develop and each new announcement.

I am not going to try and predict the next 2 weeks, but I am fairly clear we won't be meeting in person this Sunday. We will again prepare something with our YWAM team for worship at home. Please pray for our YWAM team as they consider how and when they will be able to make their way back to Queenstown. It has been an uncertain time for them but we have all learned to live together in community.

Please don't hesitate to contact me, or an Elder, or one of our Pastoral Care team with any needs or concern. I am hearing lots of stories of people contacting and supporting each other which is wonderful. Keep it up.

We will keep you informed by email and our Facebook page, as to when and how we will be able to gather again. Please be aware of those in essential areas who are working long hours. Please also be aware of who may have lost work or income. Please be aware of those on their own or in stressful living situations. Please be praying and caring.

In the meantime, may I alert you to another piece of concerning legislation our government is considering at present. (Thanks to those a few weeks ago who made submissions in regards to the Hate Speech Laws).

The Conversion Therapy Bill has passed its first reading. Should you wish to make a submission you have only until 8^{th} September to do so.

Submissions to the Justice Committee on the "Conversion Practices Prohibition Legislation Bill" are now being called for (and must be received by the committee by **8 September**, which is actually very soon)...

It is very important that a <u>large number</u> of submissions are made to the Justice Committee. The potential ramifications of this Bill for society, families, and churches are serious, and MPs need to feel the weight of or concerns. This is no time to be complacent.

It is also very important that submissions are...

- 1. in your own words, rather than just copy and paste "form" submissions
- 2. respectful and sensitive, rather than angry and hostile
- 3. thoughtful and measured
- 4. related closely and accurately to the actual text of the Bill, rather than just to generalities
- 5. if possible constructively suggesting changes or improvements to the Bill
- 6. reflecting a biblical perspective, but not normally quoting scripture
- 7. generally quite brief
