From Leadership Team Meeting this week – We brought forward this meeting by a week to discuss a proposal that would see us hold 'Vaccine Pass' Services and mixed 'Without Vaccine Pass' Services, on alternate weeks. **However, now NZ is under RED, due to Omicron spreading**, this will not be feasible as only 25 could attend. It was agreed that we want to try and implement a mixed Service of up to 50 attending fortnightly, when we get back to the **ORANGE** Traffic Light setting. We are warned that there will be difficult weeks ahead, so what changes are required for our Sunday Services over the next 2 months?

- Masks Masks will be compulsory at our Services from next Sunday 7th Feb. This Sunday we do strongly recommend you wear one. (Worship Team when at the front are not required to wear their masks).
- 2) Morning Tea We are still legally able to serve tea and coffee at Services under RED, however we decided that once we start getting confirmed cases in the Gisborne region then we won't be having morning tea/coffee. That has happened, so no Morning Teas for a while.
- 3) Offerings These will be received at the door where folk can drop them into a bucket/basket when entering. Greeters will oversee the offering.
- 4) Communion Cups are all disposable, and if servers have gloves and masks then serving is easy with the seating spaced 1 metre apart. Collecting of used cups will be done by the servers.
- 5) Closing Services, Live Streaming only It was decided that if Omicron is progressing in the community in 2-3 weeks time, then we should close the Services to avoid any spread. We are set up for live streaming, so is possible to run a service solely with the speaker and musicians.

6) What is your plan if you are required to 'self-isolate' at home? – If you do not have family or someone close you can call on should you need help for any reason, please let us know. Speak to one of the Elders or contact the Church office.
