Paula writes....

Welcome to our service this morning, a family service for all ages led by our Kidzspace team. Last week we were focussing on the image of God as the good Shepherd and us as the sheep who know His voice. I have been so encouraged in hearing the many stories of how God has been speaking to people in different ways. I wonder how you are going – slowing down: to make space to hear from God – and softening up: keeping your heart soft as to how He might be speaking to you? One thing that helps me if I feel I am trying too hard to hear, but nothing is coming, is to trust that God, the Creator of the Universe – is completely able to speak to me when He chooses. It's my job to remain open to hear.

Today Debbie and her team will be leading us to look further at God as our Shepherd and all that means to know our God is a good God, who will lead us and guide us no matter what life brings.

I have to say it has been a challenging two weeks with the events of our nation: the grief, the responses, the cause to reflect on our own attitudes, and bigger questions about what it means to live in a pluralistic society. I would like to address these issues further next term, as the questions are big and complex. For me one thing that helps, is to think of our Christian life through a mission framework.

We are a sent people, Christ followers, to go and make disciples wherever we are placed. When you go on "mission", you learn about the cultures, belief systems and contexts you go to, you build bridges, you develop understanding before saying too



much, you go with a heart to love and serve, and you pray. Then through this you wisely look for opportunities to share the hope and truth of Jesus.

We are an increasingly pluralistic society, and we need to adapt to this rather than be afraid of it. We need to build relationship bridges with people of all cultures and faiths. Through relationship comes opportunity to respectfully share the deeper things of what we believe and the hope we have. May we look for and use these opportunities well, and may we be known for our love. More to come on this!
