

I hope you have enjoyed one or two extra freedoms this week as we have moved to Level 3. Coffee on the beach was certainly one of my highlights.

We certainly won't be forgetting 2020 for a while. We also have much to be grateful for living in Aotearoa, and our heart goes out to those cities and countries around the world who have had such huge losses of life.

I also have been in contact with friends and colleagues from Vanuatu, amazingly still free from COVID19, but with many islands devastated by the cyclone. We were able to talk with some of our closest friends there, all of who lost their house, their small island has no water, and their gardens are ruined. Yet, they are already rebuilding and replanting. Here is the story that was published this week of a woman we met and shared a meal in her house:




Here is the widow of the late Pastor Peter Henly, standing joyfully by her destroyed home in Hasavaia, South Santo. She served in the mission in many islands around Vanuatu, and has dedicated her life to caring for others. We are very happy to see that God preserved her during this cyclone. She said, "My heart broke in tears to God, and I prayed a prayer of thanks

and waited to see my beloved husband in heaven." When Category 5 Cyclone Harold blew her house down, she described "...it fell over the top of me but I was okay. The house fell over me but I was protected. People thought I was dead, but I am alive! Again praise God." As she crawled out from her fallen house she smiles as though nothing happened to her. Her response ... "I have lost my house and everything thing in this world but I did not lose Jesus."

So friends, please pray for this brave Christian elder, that she will receive the care she now needs. And thank God that He protected her during this Category 5 Cyclone!

This week, we continue to learn from the book of Ephesians, Chapter 2, which contains some incredible descriptions of what God has done and who we are in Christ:



"⁴ But God is so rich in mercy, and he loved us so much, ⁵ that even though we were dead because of our sins, he gave us life when he raised Christ from the dead. (It is only by God's grace that you have been saved!)"

Tim Keller says this:

"In Christianity, the moment we believe, God imputes Christ's perfect performance to us as if it were our own, and adopts us into His family. In other words, God can say to us just as He once said to Christ, "You are my Son (or daughter), whom I love; with you I am well pleased."

You see, the verdict is in. And now I perform on the basis of the verdict. Because God loves me and He accepts me, I do not have to do things just to build up my resume. I do not have to do things to make me look good. I can do things for the joy of doing them. I can help people to help people – not so I can feel better about myself, not so I can fill up the emptiness."

May each of you know His incredible saving Grace deep in your hearts.

@prayasonenz on Monday at 8pm and click on the Zoom link.


