Paula writes... Dear Church family,

How are you doing in Week 2 of lock down? I know there are many things I am missing: freedom, coffees with friends, beach walks, park runs, general interactions with people, smiles and touch, variety. Yet I also know I have so much to be grateful for: a warm house, space outside, food to eat, work that is continuing, friends that ring, a health system in place if I need it. I have so much to be thankful for. Lockdown looks different for different people. A friend of mine wrote this:



"I'm hearing stories of people discovering new places of peace in their neighbourhood and toddlers revelling in so many adults being home. I'm also hearing stories of stressed out parents, families in strife and redundancies. It feels like the lockdown is a two speed journey. For some gift, for others grim."

I am reminded of the words of Paul:

"I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do all this through him who gives me strength." – Philippians 4:12-13

What I am praying for in my own life and home, is peace. An ability to make the most of each day, for joy in the small things and for hope for the future. I am also praying for many I know for who this time is particularly difficult for, and each day making contact with at least two or three to offer some encouragement.

For those of you who are home alone, please know you are loved and not forgotten. For those working extra hard at this time because of your area of work – thank you. For those at home with others for long periods, may you know grace and patience as well as have special moments to remember. For all of us: may we run into God even more at this time, in prayer, in reading His word, in loving others even from a distance and in creatively sharing the hope we have.


