the offering. If you prefer to donate through internet banking you can, but please email the office to let us know so we can make sure it goes to the right place.





#### Paula writes....

This week it feels like our nation is moving on a little from the Christchurch tragedy, not that the grief is in any way past, but we continue our lives, hopefully changed for good through the pain, and as we look out for others and demonstrate love and empathy in many and varied ways. As one example, I wonder how many of you wore gumboots on Friday - for the 'I am Hope Gumboot Day'? ©

The final session of the Prayer Course is on Spiritual Warfare and is a real reminder of the reality explained to us in Ephesians 6 where it says:

<sup>10</sup> Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. <sup>11</sup> Put on the full armour of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. 12 For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.

When we pray, we can make a stand for good, and against evil. We can pray the promises of God into any situation. We can pray for justice and mercy and healing: in personal situations but also much wider than that, in praying for communities and cities and nations. Pete Grieg gives 3 key points on this topic:

- 1. No one can be a pacifist in prayer. We are all caught up in a spiritual battle against 'the world, the flesh and the devil.'
- 2. We live in the gap between Christ's victory on the cross and His return. when suffering and sin will finally be eliminated.
- 3. In this gap we pray for God's kingdom to come in salvation, healing, justice, reconciliation and beauty.

One of the ways we can fight for good in prayer is to pray God's promises into a specific situation. Derek Prince says this,

You will never pray a higher or more effective prayer than when, guided by the Holy Spirit, you go to the Word, find the promise that relates to you and your situation and say, "Lord, you've said it; you do it."

I have had some challenging opportunities this week to offer non-judgemental love in ways that were challenging and surprising, and yet have also had the opportunity to pray specifically into these situations. My prayer is that God would be using every one of us to be "fighting" in prayer for good.

Next week as we conclude the Prayer Course we will have a service of Testimonies to give people opportunities to share prayers God has answered, or something significant you have learnt. Please let me know during the week if you are keen to share!

"People are often unreasonable, irrational, and self-centred. Forgive them anyway. If you are kind, people may accuse you of selfish, ulterior motives. Be kind anyway. If you are successful, you will win some unfaithful friends and some genuine enemies. Succeed anyway.

If you are honest and sincere people may deceive you. Be honest and sincere anyway. What you spend years creating, others could destroy overnight. Create anyway. Give your best anyway. In the final analysis, it is between you and God. It was never between you and them anyway."
