

Paula writes....

How have your clothes looked this week and has anyone noticed anything different in what you were wearing?

Last week we together looked at the sort of behaviours we must leave behind, "put to death" as Jesus' followers, and then those we are to replace or clothe ourselves with. Many of these related to sexuality, speech and more generally our relationships with others. Immorality, lust, greed, anger, lying: these things covering both actions and thoughts, are to be replaced by mercy, kindness, humility, gentleness, forgiveness and love. This is what it means to live well, but these are not weak-willed easy things to do. This is challenging!

The rest of Colossians 3 we look at today, moves in to look at what does this mean more specifically as we work it out in the different aspects of our lives – like in our home life and working life. Remembering in all of this that Paul is writing a letter to a specific new congregation of believers, at a specific time, and yet there are truths and principals we can apply today.



In honesty, it's not a simple passage

particularly as we look at instructions to husbands and wives and references to slaves. What is very clear is following Christ should affect all our relationships and every aspect of our lives. Incorporating our faith into every segment of our lives leads us to becoming whole.

I am on leave for a week from Monday, and our family will be taking a short break away to celebrate some milestones. Everything else will be all go as normal, and Debbie will be leading an All Age Family Service next Sunday. May you know God's strength and leading this week!
