


Today we continue with the life of David from 1 Samuel 17: the encounter between David and Goliath. In my reading I discovered a children's book called the "Defiant Giant". Although a good description of Goliath, the more I have read the story, the more I think it was David who showed amazing defiance. Not an arrogant, proud and insulting defiance – but a passionate, courageous and selfless kind – that meant he would not give in to fear, would not allow Gods people or God's name to be mocked, and which would catapult him into a bold action that changed the fate of a nation.

Godly defiance, if there is such a term, I have decided might be something to cultivate. Although in our interactions with people we are called to demonstrate the fruit of the spirit: with love, gentleness, kindness and self-control, there are situations where we are to stand strong, stand against and stand up.

Choosing to trust God and remain faithful to Him despite hard circumstances is an act of Godly defiance. Facing impossible situations with bold prayer is an act of Godly defiance.

Even facing death well, knowing we have a future hope that is guaranteed, is an act of Godly defiance.


